Bias in prevalence studies - Training School

Location: Athens, Greece

Dates: 2 – 3 May 2023



This 2-day event is a training school, part of the HARMONY COST Action 18208. Training activities with lectures, hands-on practical sessions and discussion will focus on understanding the risks of bias in epidemiological studies of prevalence. This training school is appropriate for participants with a basic knowledge of epidemiological study designs. English will be the working language of this training. Participants are encouraged to bring their laptops. Introductory material will be provided in advance of the training school.

- Understand the differences between reporting, methodological quality, and risk of bias in prevalence studies
